


MORE THAN A MISSION TRIP

Short-term medical missions and voluntourism have been fraught with ethical problems for decades. MEDLIFE was born out of a desire to do better. Rather than imposing traditional approaches, **we follow the lead of local professionals and community leaders** who've spent a lifetime understanding the issues on the ground.

Even when the trip comes to an end, our team continues following up on our projects and patients, ensuring we create the **long-term impact** that our partner communities deserve.

WHY PERU & ECUADOR?

Oral Health Status: Dental caries, which is common in many countries, remains a prevalent concern in Peru and Ecuador, especially among children. According to some studies, dental caries affects a significant percentage of children in these countries.

Rural vs. Urban Divide: Access to dental care can be challenging for those living in rural areas compared to urban centers. The Andean and Amazonian regions often have fewer dental clinics and professionals, making access to oral health care more difficult.

Traditional Diets and Oral Health: Traditional diets, which can sometimes be high in natural sugars from fruits or starchy foods, coupled with a lack of dental health education, can contribute to dental health issues.

WHAT IS A DENTAL SERVICE LEARNING TRIP?

Week-long **Dental Service Learning Trips** allow dentistry students to volunteer with local professionals, offering essential dental care to underserved communities.

Volunteers will assist in roles like:

- **Organizing and managing** the registration process for patients.
- **Setting up stations** for dental procedures and educational activities.
- **Preparing dental instruments** for use during procedures.
- **Shadowing and supporting dentists** during dental treatments and procedures.
- **Conducting workshops** to educate the community on preventative oral health practices.
- Providing instruction on proper tooth brushing techniques for children.

Volunteers will rotate through the different stations every day, gaining a comprehensive experience in various aspects of dental care and community health education.



Triage Station

Here we obtain patients' contact information, basic medical history, and other data for the physicians to use during their consultations.



Proflaxis Station

The Prophylaxis Station provides professional teeth cleaning services performed by local doctors.



Toothbrushing

The goal of this station is to educate children from ages 3 and up about dental hygiene.



Education Station

A space to provide health education on various topics such as nutrition, gender-based violence, breast and Pap screening, among other health themes.



Pharmacy Station


After the patient has visited every station indicated on their medical form, they will be directed to the Pharmacy Station to fill their prescriptions.




Dental Station

THE ABCs OF SAFE TRAVEL WITH MEDLIFE

Service Learning Trips Safety. At MEDLIFE we take safety seriously. We encourage you to read this page in conjunction with our [FAQs](#) and [booking conditions](#).



COVID-19 Insurance Coverage Options: Emergency medical insurance is included in the cost of your trip with a deductible of \$250 USD. However, **insurance for trip cancellation or disruption is not included.** We highly recommend purchasing upgraded insurance for more comprehensive protection.



Vaccination & Testing Requirements: COVID-19 Vaccination and Testing are no longer required to attend a MEDLIFE Service Learning Trip. However, we highly recommend all participants get fully vaccinated against COVID-19 (three doses) before traveling to their SLT destination.



Compulsory Safety Briefing: All participants must attend a mandatory Pre-Trip Safety Review aimed to ensure that all participants are aware of MEDLIFE procedures, precautions, and protocols. Upon arrival, volunteers will attend an extensive safety briefing that includes protective equipment along with face masks.



Safety During Mobile Clinics: We are in constant communication with our partner communities to understand their needs and concerns regarding COVID-19. Any patients exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 are screened by a medical professional and separated to avoid contact with volunteers.


